

## OLD SELAM "PIONEER" Endurance Ride



4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> 2021, 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>

We will offer 3 fabulous days of riding in the beautiful Boise Basin where Gold was discovered in 1862, and wonderful treasures are still found today. Day 1 – Friday September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 25 and 50 mile endurance rides Day 2 – Saturday September 4<sup>th</sup>, 25 and 55 mile endurance rides Day 3 – Sunday September 5<sup>th</sup>, 25 and 50 mile endurance rides

**Directions:** From I-84 in Boise take Hwy 21 NE 36 miles to Idaho City. Turn Left (north) onto Montgomery St. At the end of the street, turn left (west) and continue for 7 miles (dirt road between towns) to Centerville. Turn right (north) onto Henry's creek Rd. and continue approx. ½ mile into camp.

**<u>Camp</u>**: Ride camp is located on private property, but borders public land so weed free hay is preferred. Horse water will be supplied but bring people water. **DOGS are always welcome**, but must be leashed at all times. Do NOT bring dogs to registration, vet area, ride meetings or awards dinner. **FIRE** danger is very real this time of year – only one community fire will be allowed, if any.

**FEE Schedule:** All Distances \$110 for the 1<sup>st</sup> day ridden, \$105 for additional days, current year/reciprocating ride managers 50% off (one day only; other days at full price). Trail Riders \$25 for the 1<sup>st</sup> day ridden, \$20 for additional days. Non-AERC members will be subject to an additional \$15 per day non-member fee **JUNIORS (under age 18 as of 1/1/20) ride FREE** 

**<u>Starting Times:</u>** 50 and 55 mile riders @6:30am; LDs @ 7:30am. Trail ride any time after 9am but no later than 3pm (trail riders must check in & out with ride management) Check-in and Vetting to start approx. 4pm on Thursday Sept 3rd for Friday riders, Pre-vet for Saturday and Sunday will be at the discretion of the Vets.

<u>Trails</u>: Trails are primarily old logging roads, ATV and single-track trials on private property, US Forest Service and Idaho State Lands. The terrain is mostly sound footing with sandy surfaces, but there are rocky sections. **Hoof Protection is STRONGLY recommended** for all horses competing.
